A "cookie" is a piece of information that is stored on your computer's hard drive and which records your navigation of a website so that when you revisit that website, it can present tailored options to you based upon the stored information about your last visit.

Our website www.mcginnisloy.com uses cookies to keep track of your visits to our site, and most internet browsers are pre-set to accept cookies. We may use cookies to do a range of things including delivering content specific to your interests and to save your password so that you do not have to re-enter it every time you visit the website. Cookies help us to recognise you when you next visit our website, which in turn allows us to personally tailor the service we provide to you.

You can usually change your browser so that it will not accept cookies, but be aware that by disabling cookies, you may not be able to participate in any new features or products offered by us in the future. Some of our business partners may use cookies on the website (for example, advertisers) but we have no access to or control over these cookies.

If you are unaware of what cookies are or how they are used, we recommend you visit http://www.allaboutcookies.org as this will give you details on how to control cookie use and enable you to delete them if required. Deleting all cookies means that certain features cannot then be provided to you and you may not be able to take full advantage of all our website's features. Each browser is different, so check the "Help" menu of your browser to learn how to change your cookie preferences.

The use of cookies on our website is in conjunction with Google Analytics, which we use to gather data on trends. All information gathered from these cookies is anonymous and is used to improve the usability of the website. There are different kinds of cookies we may use, with different functions as follows:

Session cookies: these are only stored on your computer during your web session, and they are automatically deleted when the browser is closed. They usually store an anonymous session ID allowing you to browse a website without having to log in to each page. They do not collect any information from your computer.

Persistent cookies: these are stored as a file on your computer and remain there even when you close your web browser. The cookie can be read by the website that created it when you visit that website again. We use persistent cookies for Google Analytics and for personalisation cookies

Strictly necessary cookies: these cookies are essential to enable you to use the site effectively and therefore cannot be turned off. Without these cookies, the services available to you on our site cannot be provided. These cookies do not gather information about you that could be used for marketing or remembering where you have been on the internet.

Performance cookies: these cookies enable us to monitor and improve the performance of our site. For example, they allow us to count visits, identify traffic sources and see which parts of the site are most popular. We use Google analytics for this purpose and all information these cookies collect is aggregated and therefore remains anonymous.

Personalisation cookies: these cookies help us to personalise parts of the site specifically for you. These cookies are persistent and mean that when you log in or return to the website you may see things that are similar to what you have previously browsed.

Opt-In cookies: If you chose to accept cookies, we then use a cookie to record your acceptance of the use of cookies on our site.
